


Angola, once one of the world's leading coffee exporters, has been under continuous attack by South Africa since its independence in 1975. Thousands of people have been killed or disabled, and much of the country's economic infrastructure has been destroyed. Buying and drinking its excellent coffee is one way to support Angola's struggle for peace and development.

Cafe Vitoria is also available in bulk. For £48 including postage and packing we will send you a carton of 30 x 8oz vacuum packs of filter ground coffee. (Ask us for details of prices for larger quantities and for 3oz and 4oz catering sachets.)

FLAME LILY WINES

Flame Lily wines are produced from vines cultivated in the Wedza region of Zimbabwe, just north of the Limpopo River. The white wines have a delicate flowery bouquet and a fine balance of mild acidity and fruit. The red wine has been matured in oak vats for added depth.

Flame Lily wines are marketed by AA Enterprises in association with Vinceremos Wines and Spirits of Leeds, the sole importers. For every case of wine that you buy, AA Enterprises will make a donation to the Anti-Apartheid Movement for its campaigning work.

Flame Lily wines are supplied by the case of 12 x 75cl bottles and are now available in six different varieties. Delivery is charged at £6 per order of 1-5 cases; orders of 6 or more cases are delivered free – see details on order form.

TRADE AGAINST APARTHEID

In 1987, British imports from all six Southern African Front Line States combined - Angola, Botswana, Mozambique, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe - amounted to just over £157 million. British imports from apartheid South Africa in the same year totalled £658 million.

Even though British trade with South Africa has been declining under the impact of the Anti-Apartheid Movement's boycott campaign, Britain remains one of the apartheid regime's top trading partners. And the British government, defying public opinion and the worldwide campaign for economic sanctions, remains firmly committed to increasing these trade links.

The Front Line States, forced to defend themselves and their economies from unrelenting South African assault, need new trade links with the rest of the world. Positive trade with the Front Line States is an important part of the sanctions campaign and the overall fight against apartheid.







THE ANC AND SWAPO

The African National Congress and SWAPO are the liberation movements of South Africa and Namibia respectively.

The ANC, formed in 1912, is Africa's oldest freedom movement, and has since gone from strength to strength. It inspires and mobilises South Africans from every corner of the country in the fight to destroy apartheid and for a democratic, non-racial, non-sexist South Africa.

SWAPO has fought South Africa's illegal occupation of Namibia since

its foundation in 1959. SWAPO demands freedom and independence for Namibia now and the chance to build a peaceful, united country.




