

SUPPORT DURHAM'S STRUGGLE AGAINST APARTHEID

Durham students are trying to get the University to disinvest in firms which have interests or subsidiaries in South Africa. We don't want to profit from Apartheid, and we don't want to bolster up Apartheid - at the moment, by having money in these firms, we are doing both these things. We also believe that this is the most effective action that we in Britain can take to support the freedom struggle in South Africa.

The students have voted on the issue, and the result was a 63% majority for disinvestment, but as yet we have no indication that the University authorities are going to act in accordance with the students' wishes. Their stance throughout this affair has been highly ambiguous.

As part of our campaign to get the decision we want - the decision to disinvest - we are calling a National Demonstration, in Durham, on 22nd February, 1975. This Demonstration is backed by the Anti-Apartheid Movement in London, and by N.U.S. This is a vitally important issue, and we ask for the support of all students in the Demonstration. If Durham can win disinvestment, an invaluable precedent will have been set, and the struggle against Apartheid will have been carried further forward.
