**A black woman living under apartheid is forced to serve the white minority in every way.**

- she has no political, legal or human rights
- she cleans and works in the white house **and is homeless**
- she cares for white children **and is separated from her own children**
- she grows and picks fruit and vegetables **and goes hungry**

When she has outlived her usefulness to the white employers she is sent to live in a barren rural area she does not know — a so-called 'homeland'.

And when she calls for justice — she is imprisoned.

... Women will explore ways to equip and support each other in the fight against apartheid in a way that women can comfortably participate.
