

ANTI-APARTHEID MOVEMENT



On 20th January 1989 a young worker at Wm Low's supermarket in Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne, was sacked without notice for refusing to handle SOUTH AFRICAN produce. Being a part-time casual worker, under the age of 16, she has no union protection and no employment rights. We must support her by demanding an end to Wm Low's business links with the Apartheid Regime.

We ask you to do 3 things:-

- Write to the manager of the shop to protest at this unfair dismissal.
- Ask for an assurance that all worker's be allowed to act on their own conscience's in relation to South African goods.
- Inform Wm Low's that you will boycott the shop until they stop stocking South African produce.
