Sport in South Africa exists within the framework of apartheid. The facts speak for themselves :

88% of school rugby pitches - WHITES ONLY.

93% of golf courses - WHITES ONLY. 88% of cricket pitches - WHITES ONLY. 73% of athletics tracks - WHITES ONLY.

"Official" apartheid sanctioned rugby boards exist within the framework of apartheid. Those fighting for non-racial rugby inside South Africa are opposed to international sporting links until apartheid is dismantled. It is therefore impossible to claim to be 'non-political' when supporting sporting contact with South Africa when those who are striving for non-racial sport in a non-racial society are opposed to such a position. It undermines the anti-apartheid struggle and supports the propaganda of the regime.

the major sporting Britain is now collaborator with apartheid South Africa, inspite of the governments paper position of opposition to sporting links and support for the Commonwealth Gleneagles Agreement against links. The centenary of International Rugby Union could have marked the occasion for making a stand against apartheid, instead it is being used as an event to bring apartheid further into the fold of international rugby. This shameful position is emphasized by the inclusion of 6 South African Springboks in the 'Rest of the World' squad to play at Twickenham on April 19th. Such gestures towards legitimising apartheid sport in the international arena cannot and will not go unchallenged.
