

On 10 April an assassin's bullet took the life of Chris Hani, one of the most popular leaders of the freedom struggle in South Africa.

Millions of black South Africans took to the streets to demonstrate their anger at this cruel and vicious murder. But these mass protests were also an expression of their impatience at the lack of any tangible progress towards the 'new' South Africa of which there has been so much talk, since the release of Nelson Mandela over *three* years ago.

The De Klerk regime must not be allowed to delay and procrastinate any further. As a minimum, agreement must be reached immediately on the date for South Africa's first ever one-person one-vote elections, on the joint control of the security forces, and on multi-party transitional arrangements, in order to ensure that the elections are genuinely free and fair.

he people of South Africa are on the move. Through mass action they are demanding change *now*. We need to demonstrate our solidarity. Effective international pressure needs to be applied *now* on the De Klerk regime, and all others resisting democratic change.

Above all we need to compel the British government to act. Instead of backing the ANC, John Major and other British ministers appear to be more concerned in accommodating their 'friend' Chief Buthelezi who seems bent on blocking progress towards a new democratic future for South Africa.

The people of South Africa want democracy now. They want the right to decide their future through the ballot box. They want one-person one-vote elections which are genuinely free and fair.
