South Africa 1991: What Prospects for Freedom?

Apartheid is at last on its way out. But what will take its place?

Can South Africa's black majority look forward to getting the vote and building a united, non-racial and democratic country? Or will de Klerk succeed in his efforts to preserve white economic power and privilege?

How can negotiations about South Africa's future start so long as hundreds of political prisoners remain incarcerated, and thousands of political exiles cannot yet return for fear of prosecution?

De Klerk's regime has orchestrated the appalling violence which has caused over 3000 deaths in the past year. De Klerk is talking peace whilst making war - trying to undermine the African National Congress (ANC) and other democratic forces. Negotiations to end apartheid and establish a 'new South Africa' cannot begin until the violence and repression have ended and there is a climate of free political activity.

South Africa 1991: What prospects for freedom? is a series of conferences to promote informed debate about these issues and how people in Britain can advance the cause of democracy in South Africa. The conferences will benefit from having top speakers from the ANC and the Anti-Apartheid Movement and will examine:

- the changing situation in South Africa
- the role of international solidarity
- and and-apartheid campaigning priorities in Britain
