

In June 1964 Nelson Mandela was sentenced to life imprisonment in South Africa, for his part in the struggle against apartheid. In the more than 20 years of his imprisonment he has become internationally recognised and honoured. As the resistance of the people of South Africa intensifies, he has become perhaps the most vital symbol of liberation from the tyranny of apartheid and of a new way of life in that country.

The Anti-Apartheid Movement and SATIS (Southern Africa-The Imprisoned Society) campaign for the unconditional release of Nelson Mandela and all political prisoners in South Africa and Namibia. On Sunday 21 September, there will be a jointly organised sponsored 'Cycle for Mandela' to raise funds for this campaigning.

It will be an opportunity for individuals, groups and organisations to take part in an enjoyable event and contribute to the increasing solidarity and campaigning work in Britain.
