to vote,

to negotiate or strike for better conditions and higher wages,

to fully educate their children,

to live a family life—wherever they can earn their livelihood,

to move around their country freely.

AFRICANS, INDIANS and COLOUREDS do not have these rights. In fact, they have no voice in determining their own destiny.

You support racialism? Well—think again!

Vorster, South Africa's Prime Minister, supported Hitler's racism during the last war which brought about the death of millions, and misery and loss for millions more.

APARTHEID IS NOT A GAME.

South Africa has thousands of political prisoners.

Many more are detained under the "law" (Terrorism Act) held indefinitely, in solitary confinement, without access to friends or family. During this past year alone, five detainees are known to have "died".
