No government has done more to protect the Botha regime from sanctions than Mrs Thatcher's.

In the EEC, Britain has repeatedly frustrated efforts to isolate apartheid South Africa by means of sanctions. Earlier this year Thatcher and Howe refused even to condemn the racists! In the Commonwealth, Mrs.Thatcher has persistently blocked effective action against Botha. Even when the Eminent Persons Group said sanctions were necessary to avert a blood-bath, she stuck stubbornly to appeasement.

Thanks to the support of Britain, the US and West Germany, P.W. Botha has felt free to:

- renew the State of Emergency and to detain and torture his opponents by the thousands including children under the age of 12:
- tighten the media bans to keep his crisis off our TV screens;
- ignore the UN plan for Namibia's independence, and push ahead with a phoney Transitional Government:
- intensify the raids on neighbouring states and support for the terrorist activities of UNITA in Angola and the MNR in Mozambique.

None of this has made the heroic peoples of South Africa and Namibla give up their struggle for freedom.

Under the leadership of the ANC and SWAPO, they have not only survived every new wave of oppression, but come back stronger and more resolute, especially on the trade union front.

But Thatcher's role in appeasing apartheid has cost them dearly. In Southern Africa as a whole, some 3/4m. people have lost their lives since 1980 in the struggle to resist and overthrow apartheid. Thatcher and her allies in the City of London may be indifferent to this unfolding tragedy, but the British people are not. Both at home and abroad, Mrs Thatcher is isolated on the issue of sanctions.

Thatcher can and must be forced to change direction.

That's why the Anti-Apartheid Movement is calling for massive support for the SANCTIONS NOW March and Rally on Saturday 24 October.
