MARCH '85 Month of Boycott Action

The Anti-Apartheid Movement relaunched its Boycott Campaign on June 26 1984 to mark the 25th anniversary of the original boycott appeal by **Chief Albert Luthuli,** the late President of the African National Congress and first African Nobel Peace Prize winner.

This new campaign aims to:

- ★ win intensified support for the international isolation of the apartheid regime
- ★ alert the people of Britain to the growing range and variety of products being imported from South Africa and Namibia
- ★ undermine the South African economy and its war machine by denying it much-needed foreign exchange for arms, fuel etc.

The Anti-Apartheid Movement has followed up the re-launching of the Boycott Campaign by declaring March 1985 a **Month of Boycott Action.** It is appealing to organisations and individuals throughout Britain during this Month of Action to join the boycott of all products of apartheid, and to support the activities being organised to challenge the many institutions, companies, corporations etc which still choose to collaborate with apartheid.

CAMPAIGN PROGRAMME

Throughout March, organisations and individuals are being urged to organise leafletting, poster parades and pickets, for example at any shops and stores in their locality which sell South African and Namibian products. *Please remember* that products of apartheid are not only on sale in greengrocers and supermarkets. *For example,* Ford dealers sell P100 trucks imported from South Africa. South African imported clothes are on sale in many High Street shops; many health food shops sell South African imports. Please let the AAM Headquarters know details of any South African and Namibian products on sale in your area. A list of known products is available from the AAM.

Thursday 28 February/Friday 1 March ★ LAUNCH

The **Month of Boycott Action** will be launched with publicity events in London and other major centres throughout Britain. (A draft **Press Release** is being prepared for use by local Anti-Apartheid Groups and other organisations.)

A **Campaign Postcard** has been prepared for distribution to shoppers at pickets of shops selling South African and/or Namibian goods. It is designed to be completed by supporters and handed in to the Manager of the shop being picketed.

During the month, local organisations may wish to undertake a survey of local shops to gather information on which shops sell products of apartheid. A special **sticker** has been produced for display by shops which do not sell products of apartheid.

Friday 1 March/Thursday 7 March **MATIONWIDE LEAFLETTING**

A period of co-ordinated, nationwide door-todoor leafletting. A **leaflet** is available, plus artwork for Groups able to reproduce it locally. It includes appeals in support of the Boycott in a number of minority languages.

The AAM is asking for support from its Local Groups and from trade union, women's, community, student and church organisations to undertake door-to-door leafletting in their area. Local AA Groups should liaise with other local organisations to ensure effective co-ordination.



The aim of this leafletting is to reach as many households as possible: so that people can consider the issues at home, rather than being hurriedly presented with the leaflet at a picket outside a shop.

Thursday 7 March Mattional Demonstration, OXFORD

A National Demonstration is being organised by the AAM and NUS in Oxford, assembling at 6.30pm in the Corn Market, to protest at the appearance at the Oxford Union of **South African Cabinet Minister Alan Hendrickse** (Leader of the Coloured Labour Party) and **Bantustan Chief Gatsha Buthelezi.** An alternative Rally is being organised.

Wednesday 13 March **international day of action on the oil embargo**

Anti-Apartheid and Solidarity Movements throughout Western Europe are organising co-ordinated action to protest at the role of major oil companies such as Shell and BP, and shipping companies in breaking the Oil Embargo against South Africa.

Saturday 16 March **DAY OF ACTION ON TEXTILES AND CLOTHING**

National Day of Picketing of shops selling South African and Namibian imports of clothes, textiles, wool and Karakul furs, eg Country Casuals, Austin Reed. The day is being promoted by the AAM Women's Committee.

Sunday March 17/Thursday March 21 **★ "JOURNEY WITH INJUSTICE"**

"Journey with Injustice" is organised by the South Africa Group of the USPG Christian Aware. Assembling at Henley-on-Thames, participants will establish squatter camps and then be evicted, as they proceed on foot via Windsor and Southall, culminating in a "Meditation of Witness" in Central London on the 25th anniversary of the Sharpeville massacre.

Monday March 18/Sunday March 24 ★ WEEK OF LOCAL AUTHORITY ACTION AGAINST APARTHEID

A co-ordinated Week of Local Authority Action — contact your local Council to see if it is participating and how you can support their initiatives.

Thursday March 21 SHARPEVILLE ANNIVERSARY

25th Anniversary of the Sharpeville Massacre, with meetings and other activities being planned throughout Britain. There will be torchlight procession in Glasgow (details from AAM).

Saturday March 30

* NATIONWIDE DAY OF PICKETING

A co-ordinated nationwide day of picketing of supermarkets, greengrocers and other food shops which sell South African or Namibian goods. This day will be the culmination of the Month of Action and it is intended that there should be maximum activity throughout the country.
