NAMIBIA EMERGENCY CAMPAIGN

he end of June marks the start of the campaign for the elections to a Constituent Assembly, a critical phase in the implementation of the UN independence plan for Namibia. But what confidence can the people of Namibia have? Just one month before the start of the campaign the notorious Koevoet paramilitary unit, reclassified as a police force, had gone on a murderous rampage across the north of the country, provoking students and teachers into a mass protest strike; the release of Namibian political prisoners and detainees had not even begun; and the repeal of apartheid laws and return of refugees was only just beginning.

As a permanent member of the UN Security Council, Britain has a special responsibility for ensuring the full implementation of the independence plan. So far Mrs Thatcher's main contribution has been to legitimise the slaughter of SWAPO members and supporters by the South African military machine.

Against this background the Namibia Emergency Campaign, convened by the Namibia Support Committee and the Anti-Apartheid Movement in consultation with SWAPO, the liberation movement of Namibia, has called for a week of intensive activity throughout the country: We all must:

- Raise massive financial support for the SWAPO Election Campaign Appeal;
- Demonstrate our support for the Namibian people and to build public awareness of the critical situation in their country;
- Besiege Ministers and the Foreign Office with questions about official policy, and we need to speak or write to MPs to ensure that they press the government to fulfil its obligations to the people of Namibia;
- Bombard the media with protests over their misrepresentation of events in Namibia since 1 April.
