

The AAM has launched a £75,000 HQ Expansion Appeal to provide funds for the expansion of its Mandela Street Headquarters. Since the AAM moved to its existing premises in 1982 its work has multiplied dramatically. Its membership has tripled, as has the print-run of AA News, and the number of local Anti-Apartheid Groups has risen to almost 200.

The AAM will only be able to maintain the momentum of the campaign in Britain in support of the freedom struggle in Southern Africa if it has an expanded staff, larger headquarters and up-todate equipment.
