WOMEN AND APARTHEID

This dayschool is about women in Southern Africa and the circumstances of their lives. It is about the social conditions and the laws that affect them, their education, health and conditions of work, and also the physical and mental torture they experience in their fight against the apartheid regime. It is also about the ways in which women have organised in the past and are fighting today. It is about the part they play in the struggle for liberation of the people of Southern Africa.

Black women in Southern Africa suffer the triple oppression of their race, sex and class. They experience racism in every aspect of their lives their work, their families, their health, their education. However it is too often forgotten that women in Southern Africa are the backbone of the struggle against apartheid.

Women in the Anti-Apartheid Movement have been working for many years to raise the level of consciousness, within the AA Movement itself, about the role of women in the struggle. In order to aid AA women activists in this work, particularly in carrying the message both to the British public and the women's movement, the AA Women's Committee and the London AA Committee have organised a dayschool, under the guidance of the Swapo Women's Council and the ANC Women's Section, for women about <u>Women in South</u> Africa and Namibia.

- 3) Each workshop to be divided into theory section and discussion period.


